Injury from a collision with bike or car on the Strand and in Somerset House courtyard.	Participants	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The area on the Strand in front of Somerset House is pedestrianised but cyclists and cars are able to use it. Groups are advised to take extra care in this area, sticking to the pavement around the perimeter of the area where possible.# • Vehicles are able to access Somerset House courtyard for deliveries and access needs. These are directed by security but groups are advised to

			take care in this area, sticking to the pavements where possible.
Injury from a slip, trip or fall in the grounds of Somerset House	Participants, CG staff & Educators	L	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Groups are advised to take extra care on the surfaces beneath the archway at the entrance of the gallery. These have raised curbs and in wet weather all surfaces may become slippery. Grounds inspected daily by security staff. The school/college/organisation is responsible for all students during their visit and fully qualified teaching staff or group leaders must be present at all times The school/college/organisation will ensure there is an appropriate ratio of staff to participants. Security staff qualified to administer first aid always present on site.
Injury from a fall from the balustrades around the courtyard of Somerset House with a deep drop behind.	Participants, CG staff & Educators	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Groups must always be under the supervision of accompanying responsible adults e.g. teachers, group leaders. Signage is present informing visitors not to sit on balustrades. Security officers patrolling are instructed to warn against and prevent attempts to climb.

The school/college/organisation is responsible for all participants during CG workshop sessions and fully qualified staff must be present at all times. The school/college/organisation will ensure there is an appropriate ratio of staff to participants.
