Please note that the minimum age for participation is 18. By booking you confirm that you are over 18.

CANCELLATION POLICY

If you change your mind within 14 days of booking, you may cancel with a full refund. A full refund will also be given for all cancellations received by 4 weeks before the start of a course. Less than 4, but more than 2 weeks before the start of a course, a refund of 50% of the course fee applies. No refund can be given within 2 weeks of the start of a course.

Important notice for all courses with Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) access: We normally make some course materials available on our VLE by 4-6 weeks before the start of a course. If you book within this period, Customer Rights legislation requires that a) you give us consent to supply digital content and b) acknowledge that the right to cancel with refund will be lost if you access this content (please note that your access will be visible to us). This is fulfilled by ticking the consent button to our terms and conditions

We do whatever we can to ensure that courses take place as advertised but we reserve the right to make changes or cancellations. In the unlikely event that we have to cancel any course, we shall offer you full repayment of your course fee.

On-campus course delivery: lectures are given at our Vernon Square campus at 19:00, last for an hour, and are followed by discussion and drinks.

Online course delivery: this consists of pre-recorded lectures, released weekly over 10 weeks (Autumn and Spring terms) or 5 weeks (Summer term) and live discussions for each lecture, delivered via Zoom on Wednesdays at 20:00 (London time).

Learning Resources on our Virtual Learning Environment (VLE)

All VLE materials will be available to you until four weeks after the end of the course. Both on campus and online learners have downloadable pre-course and further reading, and handout materials. Online learners have a forum on the VLE where they can put questions to the lecturers ahead of the Wednesday discussions. N.B. Lecture and discussion recordings for online learners are not downloadable.

Advice for Students with Reduced Mobility

The Campus at Vernon Square

Vernon Square was built as a school by the London City Council in the early twentieth century and has more recently served SOAS, University of London as a second campus.

The building is fully accessible, with step-free entry, single-level flooring, disabled toilets, lift access to all rooms, and free on-site parking for blue badge holders. The Lecture theatre, where Showcasing Art History takes place, is air-conditioned and has a hearing loop.
